The Following Rules should apply for the setting up of Parent/Child premises and or Sites on CFRMIS.

- Multi-occupied premises (such as Multi-Occ Offices, shopping centres etc) should be set up as a parent and child premises on CFRMIS.
- Small Multi-Occ or dual use premises need not be set up as Parent and Child Premises. For example where you might have a shop or a pub with accommodation above, Or may be a shop with one or two small office sub-lets above.
- Whether a premises should be set up as a parent and child is down to individual officers judgement. If in doubt Guidance can be sought from the Community Safety Managers or the Policy and Implementation Manager.
- Sites should be set up for premises which share a common curtilage or are part of the same organisation on a campus. For Instance Honda would be classed as a

site. Most industrial Estates can also be classed as sites for CFRMIS purposes. A school campus with a variety of out buildings would also be classed as a site.

- It would be possible to have parent and child premises contained on a site. For instance a multi occupied office block contained on an industrial estate would be a parent and child premises on a site.
- When auditing a Parent and child premises it may be too onerous to carry out a full audit (parts A, B and C) on each occupier. It may be sensible to carry out a full audit for the premises as a whole. This is particularly the case with a large Multi-Occ such as a shopping centre. Another option for larger Parent and Child premises is to carry out an Audit of the Premises as a whole and supplement with full audits on selected occupiers.
